Don't forget to share this information with your family and friends to help them become more Cyber Safe ©



Cyber safety consists of two words – "cyber" and "safety". "Cyber" is anything digital, so all devices we use for communications with others. "Safety" is a state of being protected, free of harm, comfortable and peaceful.



Cyber bullying is interacting with others online with the intention of hurting or upsetting them. It is bad and harmful and there is no one who "deserves it".



Talk to your parents, a trusted teacher or other trusted adult if you experience anything that troubles you or you are not feeling safe while using the Internet.



Don't break rules online. No one is anonymous on the Internet. Everyone can be known by the identification number of his/her device or by the IP address he/she is using.



Digital fingerprint is a mark you leave when you go online. There is no way to erase your digital fingerprint (photos, documents or any other posts) completely from cyber space.



Online reputation is the opinion you build about yourself online. Don't post, blog, link, like or subscribe to anything unless you are not 100% sure it doesn't destroy your reputation.



Privacy settings are the parameters of your account in different services, which determine others access to your account.
