Social Engineering

This Workshop Notes summarizes the most important information highlighted in the workshop you attended. The points below serve as a reminder to help you stay aware and informed about Social Engineering. Social Engineering is the act of manipulating people into performing actions. The objective is to trick someone into providing his or her valuable information or access to that information.



There are two main categories under which all social engineering attempts could be classified – computer or technology based, and human based deception.



The technology-based is to deceive the user into believing that he is interacting with the 'real' computer system and get him to provide confidential information.



The human approach is done through deception, by taking advantage of the victim's ignorance, and the natural human inclination to be helpful and liked.



Do not click on any attachment in an email coming from an unknown source.



Recognize that banks and IT administrators will never ask for passwords.



Don't give out credentials to anyone, no matter how much authority they have.



Maintain different passwords for different online services.



Install antivirus software, which will alert spam, virus and malware, affected files.



Be careful of your surrounding when you are viewing your personal information.
